## from the Pastor's Desk

#### Dear Church,

For those of you who missed it, Rally Day (Sept 10) was a busy, yet wonderful Sunday of celebration. We looked at the text from the Jesus' sermon on the mount where he calls us a "city on a hill". This is the same place that lesus calls his listeners "the light of the world." I am reminded that faith cannot be formed in a vacuum. We need each other in order to grow together to be lesus. We cannot be a city by ourselves. And that beacon of light cannot exist without each other in that city. We DO life together and that matters, to ourselves and as our collective witness to the world.

This can feel overwhelming at time, but is also a beautiful picture of the community of God. As I continue to think about all that happened that morning I remember:

We cannot have a praise band with various gifts in different members. Otherwise it is just a soloist. Same with the choir!

We cannot give out 3<sup>rd</sup> grade bibles without people who give financial gifts to support children's education programming. We also cannot do it without volunteers who teach our children the Word of God or parents and grandparents who bring those kids to learn to love God.


We cannot have a noisy offering without a mission team who loves to share what God is doing, not just in Sandy Lake, but around the world. We cannot have a noisy offering without adults who have taught our children that loving Jesus is not just about what they get out of it, but how we take care of others. And we cannot have a noisy offering without the many, many people who brought their loose change in support of this effort. (The total to be divided between Presbyterian Disaster Assistance Earthquake relief and the Sudan Refugee Crisis was over \$280!!)

And finally that Sunday we had a Baptism! (Congrats Isabelle!!) And in our tradition, we believe that baptism is never a "me and Jesus" thing but an act of the church. We made promises to that child and we welcomed her into our family while also remembering God's love is freely given even before we (or our parents) accept that love in the sacrament!

We are a city on a hill. Thanks be to God! My hope as you read this newsletter is that you may decide to get more deeply involved in the life of light that we are privileged to be here at Sandy Lake. Maybe you pick something that is going on that you have never experienced and you attend. Maybe you invite a friend to church or funfest. Maybe you turn on your live stream if you have not been able to come back to worship and join us at home. Maybe you financially give to the ministry and mission of SLPC. Maybe you pray over what you have read in this newsletter- that God may be the one who is glorified in all we do.

We are a city on a hill. Thanks be to God.

## **CHURCH HAPPENINGS**






